For nearly 40 years, St. Mary's "Front Door Ministry" has quietly opened its heart to the neighbourhood, offering weekly food hampers to 30–50 families who rely on a friendly face. # CHRIST THE KING CAMP

Marean Lake, Saskatchewan



Christ the King Camp began with a bold act of faith and friendship. In 1961, Father Francis Meyer Zielinski, then pastor of Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Porcupine Plain, dreamed of creating a place where children could encounter God through the beauty of nature. With no funds of his own, he borrowed money from friends and purchased the lakeside property. Together with volunteers — many from neighbouring Knights of Columbus councils — he cleared the land and built the first simple structures. Youth camps began in 1963, and after Father Zielinski's sudden passing in 1970, his friend Monsignor Edmond Ulinski carried the mission forward. In 1971, the Rex Mundi Society was formed to operate the camp.

The Sask K of C Charitable Foundation proudly assisted in the rejuvenation project, providing secure, clean and healthy facilities for youth campers.

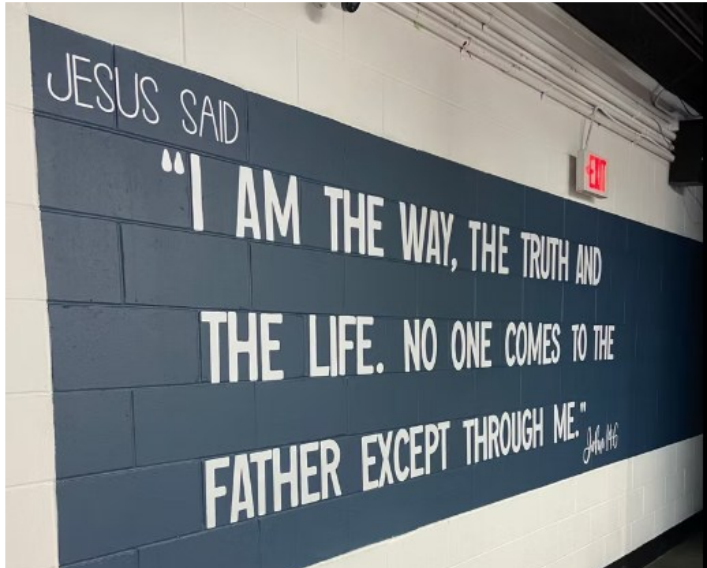

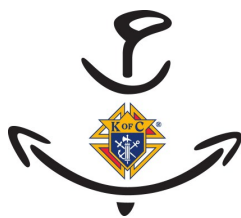

We offer a range of free and confidential services including: pregnancy tests, mental and emotional support, educational programs, baby supplies, and community advocacy. Options Pregnancy Centre serves Regina and the surrounding area in southern Saskatchewan. We are one of many faith-based centres in the province, look for one near you.

There are three Options Pregnancy / Pregnancy Options Centres in Saskatchewan. Northeast Pregnancy Options, with offices in Melfort and Humboldt, serves communities across the northeast; the Saskatoon Pregnancy Options Centre supports the greater Saskatoon area; and the Options Pregnancy Centre in Regina, featured in the photo, serves families in the south. All three centres operate independently, yet they share a common mission rooted in Christian values. Each centre offers emotional support, information, and essential supplies, walking alongside clients with dignity and respect during a vulnerable time in their lives.

# Sask KofC Charitable Foundation Endowment Funds

*The Board of Directors of the Sask K of C Charitable Foundation established an Endowment Strategy enabling major donors to assist the Foundation in directing the annual earnings from the Endowment Fund established by their endowment to charitable causes.*

**Sask K of C Capital Endowment Fund** Annual earnings from this Endowment Fund provide Grants to qualifying Charities and Catholic organizations throughout the province. The Grants are allocated by recommendation of the Grants and Bursary Committee and approved by the Sask K of C Charitable Foundation Board of Directors.

**Sask K of C Vocations Endowment Fund** was established as a means of supporting a holistic, sustainable approach to meeting the increasing need for leaders within our Church. Each year earnings generated by the Endowment Fund are used to create a bursary of an equal amount for each Seminarian from Saskatchewan Archdioceses, Dioceses and Eparchy.

**Brother Isidore Endowment Fund** (Yorkton) will support the education and development of individuals in pursuit of a religious vocation with preference given to individuals originally from within the Yorkton trading area.

**Indigenous & Non-Indigenous Relations Endowment Fund** (Fr. Tonny Dizey & Fr Garry Kuntz Regina) was formed to support projects and programs designed to facilitate the communications, understanding, and reconciliation between the Indigenous & Non-Indigenous communities.

**Fr. O'Leary Columbian Society Endowment Fund** (Saskatoon Council 5104) generates much-needed funding & support for the less fortunate within our Christian communities.

**Campion Knights Endowment Fund** (Regina) was established as a means of providing an annual Bursary to a student enrolled in the University of Regina Campion College Campus. Preference is given to graduates of Mother Teresa Middle School in Regina.

**Marvin & Pat DeSchryver Family Endowment Fund** (Denzil) provides an excellent medium for funnelling their charitable donations. They wish to continue using this as a legacy for themselves and their family.

**Joseph M Glasser Family Endowment Fund** (Lampman) provides a legacy of Joseph's generosity and commitment in support of the Catholic faith and those less fortunate than himself.

**George Lewans Endowment Fund** (Shaunavon) was established as a legacy of a humble individual who believed in offering assistance to the poor and support for Catholic values and faith.
